An area in the South destroyed by Union cannon fire.






Charleston after the Civil War

This image is the view of a white racist cartoonist about the Freedman's Bureau during reconstruction.





This is an image of Andrew Johnson's impeachment trial.






This image depicts the 15th amendment.






