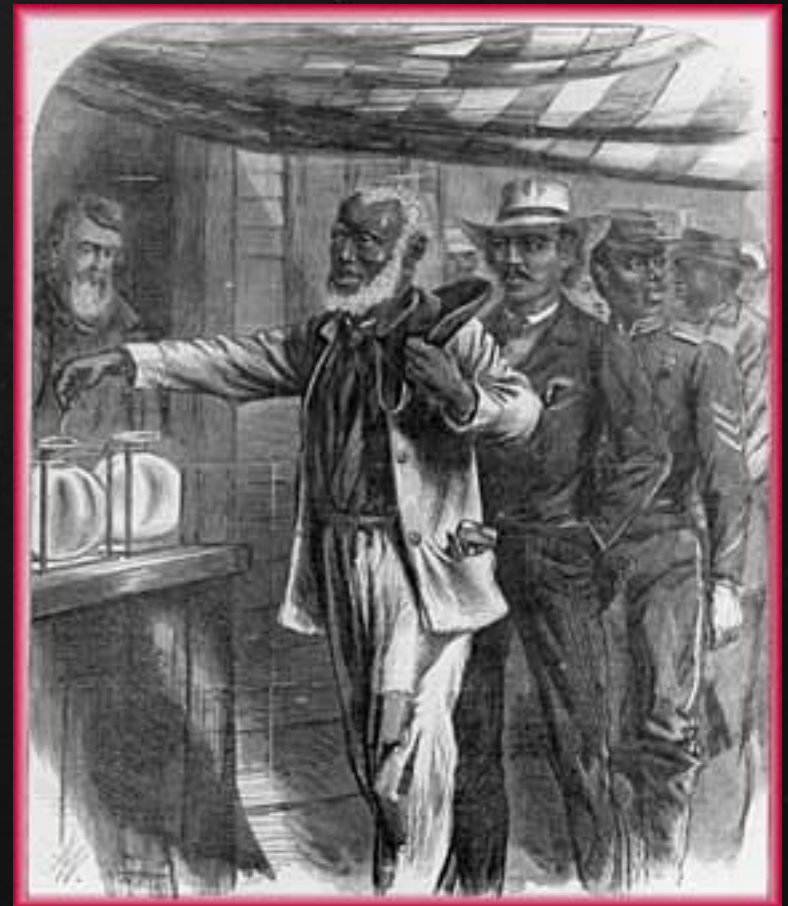

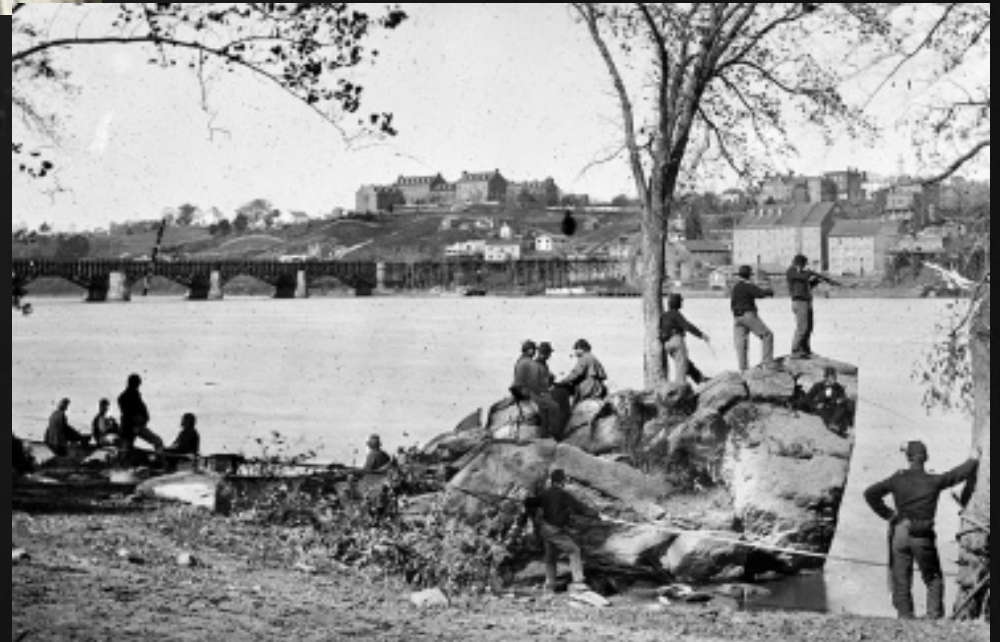




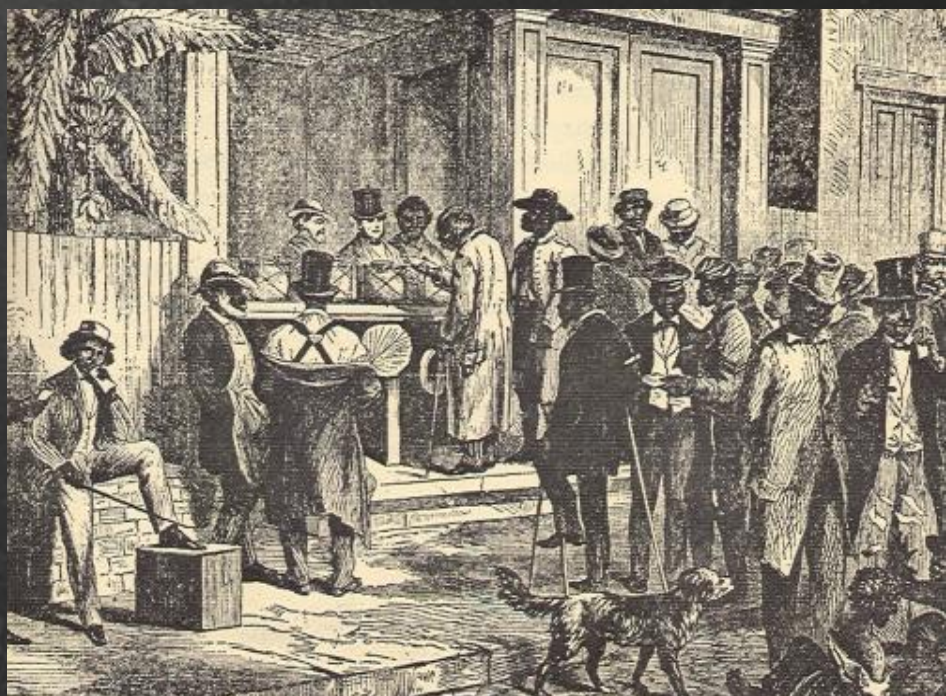


Klu Klux Klan members lynching a African American. Man on the far right is directing them to take him away.

A African American man is hanged over night by the Ku Klux Klan in his front yard.







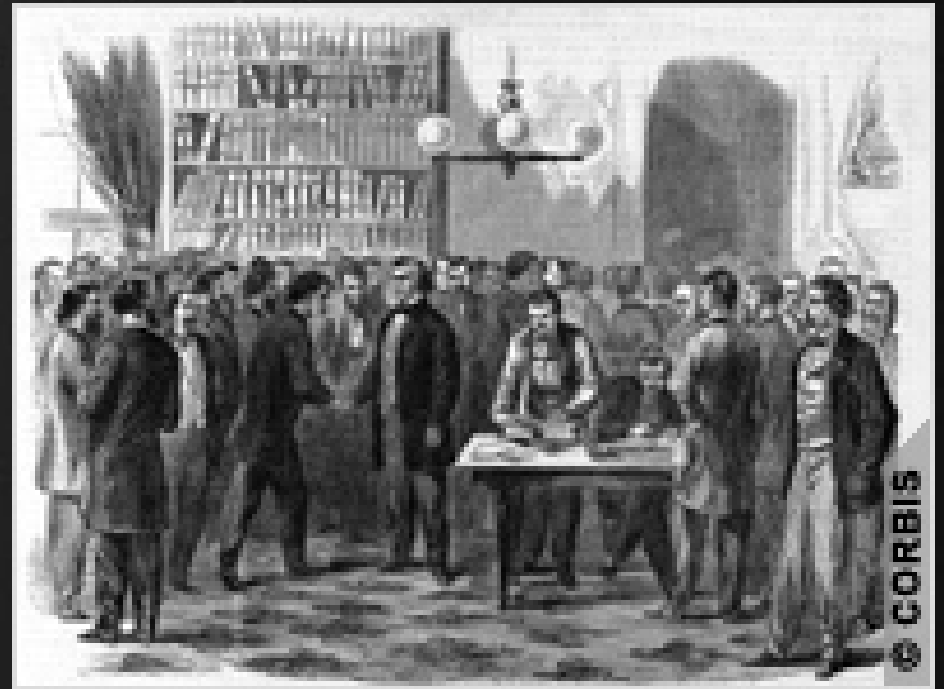
Drawing of African American in the North that has been able to keep his family alive and was able to buy a horse.
